#### **HeroCard Galaxy**

- Released in May 2006
- Themed Expansion decks: Crab and EGG

Battle for galactic domination with this family-friendly science fiction game. HeroCard Galaxy comes as a two player game with the Mechagen and Cult Hero decks and can be expanded up to four players with the Crab and EGG Expansion decks or any other HeroCard deck.

#### **HeroCard Champion of New Olympia**

- Released in July 2006
- Themed Expansion decks: Ferrion and Talon

Players take on the roles of super heroes who investigate leads, uncover plots, and foil crimes in a city made of up map tiles in this kid-friendly game. HeroCard Champion of New Olympia comes as a two player game with the T'oa King and Deva Hero decks. It can be expanded to up to four players with the Ferrion and Talon Hero decks or any other HeroCard decks.

### **HeroCard Rise of the Shogun**

- Released in August 2006
- Themed Expansion decks: Miko and Prince

HeroCard Rise of the Shogun focuses on territorial control, deft manipulation of resources, and brutal battles against your opponents. HeroCard Rise of the Shogun comes as a two player game with the Samurai and Ninja Hero decks. It can be expanded to up to a four player game with the Miko and Prince Hero decks or any other HeroCard deck.

### **HeroCard Cyberspace**

- Released January 2007

HeroCard Cyberspace is a German-style anime hacking game with a distinct manga look. It is an excellent game for tactical players. HeroCard Cyberspace is a game for up to four players. It comes with the Bouncer, Sinner, Bioengineer, and Cryptomancer heroes; however, any HeroCard hero deck may be played in this game.

### **HeroCard Orc Wars**

- Released July 2007
- Themed Expansion decks: Ranger and Sorceress

HeroCard Orc Wars is an asymmetrical fantasy game of fierce combat in which one player plays a horde of orcs and the other players play individual elves. The base game comes with five scenarios and over 50 pieces. HeroCard Orc Wars is a two player game that comes with the Paladin and Orc King Hero decks. It can be expanded to up to four players with additional HeroCard decks.

### **HeroCard Nightmare**

- Released September 2007

HeroCard Nightmare is a psychological thriller in which the last surviving dreamer wins. With its surreal art and deductive gameplay, HeroCard Nightmare keeps players on the edge of their seats. HeroCard Nightmare is a two to four player game. It comes with four Hero decks, Wil, Isis, Aisling, and Deon; however, any HeroCard Hero deck may be played in this game.
